# Groovelit Links

Here are some ready-made writing games on Groovelit that are connected with **extracts** from **The Great Gatsby**. Each game includes a short extract to read first.

### Chapter 1

Write about a person you have known who stood out because of their hope or belief in something. They might have been ambitious, optimistic, or determined in a way others did not understand. Describe what made them different, how you viewed them at the time, and whether your opinion changed later. Show the contrast between their dreams and the world around them.

### Chapter 2

Write about a place that felt bleak, forgotten, or uncomfortable to be in. It might be somewhere you passed through rather than stayed. Describe what it looked, sounded, and felt like, and how the atmosphere affected your mood. Include one striking detail that made the place feel symbolic or unsettling, and explain why it stayed in your mind.

### Chapter 3

Write about a moment when you were surrounded by excitement, noise, or celebration. It might have been a party, an event, or a busy place full of people. Describe what was happening around you using vivid sensory details. Then explore how you felt inside – whether you felt included, overwhelmed, excited, or strangely separate from it all – and why that moment stayed with you.

### Chapter 4

Write about a time when someone (or you) tried very hard to seem impressive or convincing. It might have involved exaggeration, half-truths, or hiding part of the real story. Describe what was said, what made it feel awkward or unconvincing, and how you reacted in that moment. Show the tension between how things appeared on the surface and what you sensed underneath.

## Chapter 5

Write about a moment when a small change suddenly lifted your mood. It might have been a change in weather, a message, a look, or a simple realisation. Describe what things felt like before the change, what shifted, and how your emotions transformed. Use the outside world to reflect what was happening inside you.

## Chapter 6

Write about a moment when you decided to change who you were or how others saw you. It might have been a new name, a new role, a new goal, or a fresh start. Describe what pushed you to make that change, how you presented yourself differently, and what you hoped this new version of you would achieve. Show the gap between where you started and where you wanted to be.

## Chapter 7

Write about a moment when the truth did not match what you desperately wanted to believe. It might have involved a relationship, a dream, or an expectation. Describe what you hoped was true, what was actually said or revealed, and how that moment felt when your certainty began to fall apart. Show the emotional impact of realising that something could not be undone.

## Chapter 8

Write about a time when you wished you could go back and change something. It might have been a relationship, a decision, or a version of yourself you miss. Describe what you were trying to hold onto, why it mattered so much, and how it felt to realise that the past could not be recovered in the way you hoped. Show the pull of memory and regret.

## Chapter 9

Write about a dream or goal that keeps pulling you forward, even when it feels just out of reach. Describe what this dream represents to you and why it matters. Show how time, memory, or past experiences affect your pursuit of it. End by reflecting on whether continuing to strive feels hopeful, exhausting, or both.

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
